
At our last two General Meetings we have had visiting Presenters from COTA address the Members on issues affecting their lives and ways to deal with them, and we hope to continue with this for the future.

Come along for a pleasant social evening. Bring a Asian themed plate of food to share. Tea and coffee will be available.





As long as the message of beauty, joy, courage, the wonders of the Earth, Infinity, and other human reach your heart, you will remain young.


Only when your wings hang low and the inside of your heart becomes covered with the snow of pessimism and the ice of cynicism, and only then you have really become old.
